

Eva Koleva Timothy was born and raised in Sofia, Bulgaria at the height of the Cold War where she learned first-hand the inestimable value of freedom, under the cloud of suppression posed by the regime.

Her parents were both passionate advocates for the American ideals of democracy and she recalls vividly that night when, at 3:00 A.M., they woke her with the news of the Berlin Wall's fall and took her to the city center to witness the beginnings of a democratic revolution in Eastern Europe.

At the age of 18 she travelled to the U.S. to study at the University of Utah where she received a B.A. in Communications - emphasis on film and photography. She would later return to Europe where she studied at The Oxford School of Photography and received a Licentiate Certification from the Royal Photographic Society of Great Britain.

Upon her return in 2005, Eva realized her lifelong dream of becoming a citizen of the United States of America at the JFK Library in Boston.

Eva's photography, representing largely historical themes, has been exhibited, published and collected around the world.

A passionate speaker, she takes great pleasure in sharing her enthusiasm for freedom and her own intriguing story.
